## PLANTS THAT ATTRACT AND PROTECT BIRDS "BIRDSCAPING"

Birds are attracted to bright colors, fruits and berries. Areas with dense foliage, evergreen, water and shade appeal to them at this elevation. Due to the shortness of our growing season, the few berries that are produced will likely be eaten by our feathered friends before you can get them yourself!

Birds also need winter cover. You can create bird sanctuaries by using a combination of any of these varieties designed to suit your site.

Bird houses and bird feeders are also key to you "Birdscape". Strategically placed they can provide hours of entertainment!
